As from today (Monday September 9th) and until further notice this section will not be required to carry out any duties at High Chimneys Observation Post.

In accordance with Company Orders this section will provide an "Inlying Picquit" of three men each night who will be prepared to act promptly in cases of emergency when called upon.

A "Weekly Rota" has been compiled and members must notify Section Commanders immediately if they are not prepared to be on the alert during the night and morning allotted to them. The first two mames on the Rota for each day will be required to carry out strict observation between the hours of 05-00 and 06-30 hours, at the places stated.

Particular attention must be given to the following observations.

- 1. Any form of signalling from the ground.
- 2. If any enemy aircraft circled or turned at any particular point.
- 3. Parachutists or Parachutes dropped.
- 4. Enemy aircraft forced down.

Immediately any important observation has been made phone Section Commander (Lapworth 241) or if no phone is available call out by messenger, but at the same time prepare accurate information.

Section Commanders must take responsibility for phoning Police, Military or Bell Ringing.

All Section Commaders have been instructed to warn all Home Guards of the importance of this duty owing to the expected attempt at Parachute landings during the present month.

  - (b) Second man will personally supervise the ringing of the nearest Church Bells. Arrangements should be made that the warning should be taken up and all other Church Bells in the Platoon Area will be rung.
- (2) When observed other than from an O.P. the same action will be taken by the man concerned who in this case may have to undertake to carry out both the above duties himself.
- (3) When a landing is REPORTED to a Home Guard, the Report must be verified before the alarm is given, unless person making the report is personally known to him and full relaines can be placed in her or him.
